Our canteen has agreed to cooperate by not selling nut based products. If your child loves peanut butter or Nutella, we ask that this be a treat saved for their time at home. Many muesli bars contain nuts and avoiding these for school would also be helpful.

Hopefully this small gesture of cooperation, as well as being a positive lesson for other children in learning to be caring and cooperative.

We shall be reminding students about allergies and how to help children stay safe. This will include the importance of children not sharing food at school. Thank you.

Mrs Carter and Mrs Elliott continued to implement the Kids Matter strategies attending training in Port Macquarie and then in servicing staff here at our school.

A reminder that Band practise had to be postponed and will be held on Monday morning next week. Please bring your instruments.



