On Friday 22nd March, 12 boys from Tinonee Public School participated in a round one cricket match against Taree West Public School. The team included: Chase, Charlie, Zayne, Kobi, Kody, Alex, Ben, Hayden, Ryan, Oliver, Gabe and Josh. The boys lost the toss and were sent into bat. Alex and Chase got Tinonee PS off to a good start before Alex was bowled for 7. The score was 1 for 18. Chase and Kobi steadied the ship with Kobi making 4 and combining well with Chase to take the score at 2 for 64. Chase was lucky being dropped twice on zero and he made Taree West pay with an impressive 34 runs, with some fine drives and pull shots. He was caught at square leg by a superb catch. Zayne made 1 run before being bowled and Ben was unlucky to be bowled out first ball. Hayden and Ryan came to the crease at 5 for 74. Hayden and Ryan played some impressive shots with both boys making 14 runs. Oliver came into bat with 2 balls left in the innings. Tinonee made 121 off 25 overs, which was a good effort.

Taree West got off to a great start with the openers making 40 and 26 respectively. Chase bowled well without luck, finishing with figures of 0 for 18 off 5 overs. Zayne was the most impressive bowler for Tinonee with 0 for 11 off 4 overs. Charlie bowled 1 over for 3 runs; Josh 1 over for 2 runs; Ryan 1 over for 7 runs; Kobi 3 overs for 18; Ben 2 overs for 21; Hayden 0 for 5 off 1 over; Oliver 0 for 6 off 1 over; Gabe 0 for 18 off 4 overs and Kodi 0 for 17 off 2 overs. Taree West passed the Tinonee score of 121 in the 22nd over. It was a great effort by the Tinonee boys, coming up agonisingly short by 12 balls. After the game, the photographers from Wingham Chronicle came and took some snaps of the team. Thanks to Mrs Agnew and Mr Mitchell for being an umpire at square leg.
