CURRICULUM

At Tinonee Public School, our emphasis on vocabulary development is at the heart of our commitment to creating a rich learning environment. Recognising the crucial role of vocabulary in literacy, we adopt a systematic approach based on the NSW Department of Education's three-tier system.

The Three-Tier System of Vocabulary

- 1. **Tier 1 Words:** These are everyday words that are commonly used in conversation and are usually learned through natural language exposure. Examples include words like 'house,' 'book,' and 'run.'
- 2. Tier 2 Words: These are high-utility words that are used across various subjects and are essential for academic success. They are often more precise or sophisticated synonyms for words many children will know. Examples include 'accumulate' instead of 'collect,' 'fortunate' instead of 'lucky,' and 'observe' instead of 'see.'
- 3. **Tier 3 Words:** These are subject-specific words that are typically encountered in academic texts. Examples include 'photosynthesis' in science, 'democracy' in social studies, and 'alliteration' in English.

How We Teach Vocabulary

- Explicit Instruction: We introduce new words directly, providing definitions, examples, and opportunities for students to use the words in context.
- Rich Language Environment: Our classrooms are language-rich settings where students are encouraged to use a variety of words in their speaking and writing.
- **Multiple Exposures:** We ensure that students encounter new words multiple times, in various contexts, to reinforce understanding and retention.

How Parents Can Help

- **Read Aloud:** Reading to your child exposes them to new vocabulary in context. Discuss the meaning of new words as you encounter them.
- Encourage Curiosity: When your child encounters an unfamiliar word, look it up together in a dictionary or online.
- Play Word Games: Engage in word games like Scrabble, Boggle, or even simple word-matching games to make learning fun.
