CURRICULUM

At Tinonee Public School we teach a variety of mathematical strategies to build numeracy skills. Here are some key mathematical strategies used, to help you understand and better communicate with your children about their learning.

1. Concrete-Pictorial-Abstract (CPA) Approach: This method helps students grasp complex mathematical concepts by using tangible objects (concrete), moving to pictures (pictorial), and finally to abstract symbols. For instance, younger students might use blocks to learn addition and subtraction, then draw the blocks, before finally using numbers only. This progression builds a deep understanding and eases the transition to abstract thinking.

2. Problem-Solving Strategies: Schools encourage students to develop their problem-solving skills through strategies such as:

- Working backwards: Starting from the desired outcome and stepping backwards to find the solution.
- Drawing diagrams: Visual representations that help clarify complex problems.
- Using logical reasoning: Teaching students to make inferences and deductions that lead to correct answers.

3. Number Talks: Number talks are short, daily exercises aimed at improving students' mental calculation skills. During these sessions, teachers pose problems, and students discuss their methods and reasoning out loud. This practice not only boosts arithmetic fluency but also fosters a classroom culture of open mathematical discussion.

Understanding and Engaging: As parents, engaging with your child about their school day and understanding the strategies they're learning can make a significant difference. Consider incorporating simple mathematical discussions at home, whether it's through cooking, shopping, or even playing games that involve counting and strategising.

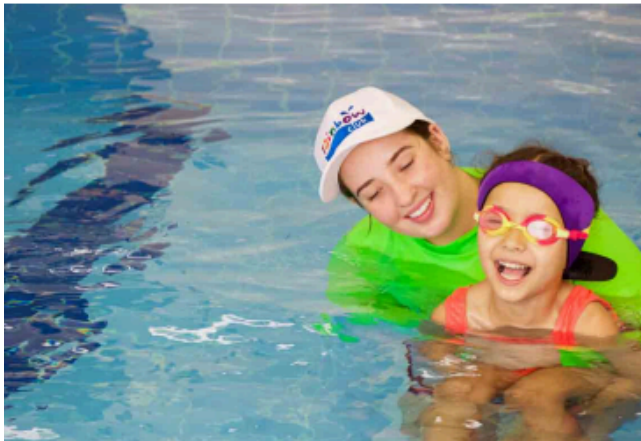


